City of Glenwood Springs Residential Parking Permits

1. Residents residing in the following areas may apply for a residential permit:
 - a. Pitkin Avenue – 800 and 900 blocks
 - b. Colorado Avenue – 700, 800 and 900 blocks
 - c. Grand Avenue – 700, 800 and 900 blocks
 - d. Cooper Avenue – 700, 800 and North half of 900 block (900 – 916)
 - e. Blake Avenue – 700 block
 - f. 7th Street – 200, 300 and 400 blocks
 - g. 8th Street – 100, 200, 300 and 400 blocks
 - h. 9th Street – 100, 200, 300 and 400 blocks
 - i. 10th Street – 200 block
2. A maximum of 2 permits will be issued per residential unit.
3. Residents will be required to apply for permits in person at the Police Department, show proof of residency, registration of vehicle, and pay \$50 administrative fee per permit issued.
4. Permits will be issued for a maximum of 1 year, with renewals processed by the original application standards within 30 days of expiration. Expiring permits must be returned to the Police Department upon renewal.
5. Permits will only be valid upon the vehicle matching the registration listed upon issuance.
6. Permits will only apply to exemption from the 2 Hour limits for parking in the downtown zone, and will NOT exempt parking in short-term loading zones, no parking zones or handicap spaces.
7. Parking on public streets is limited to 72 hours under State Law and City Ordinances, and permit holders must still comply with this requirement.
8. Parking permits must be hung from the rearview mirror or otherwise prominently displayed for inspection of all permit information by Parking Enforcement personnel.
9. Residential Parking Permits are not transferrable. Abuse or “loaning” of permits will result in revocation of all permits issued to a resident.
10. Residential Parking Permits shall not be valid in the 700 block of Cooper Avenue or the City/ County parking lot in the 700 block of Colorado Avenue on the East side of Colorado Avenue. Vehicles with permits that park in those locations shall be treated as vehicles without permits for purposes of enforcement.
11. Other City parking lots or structures that are signed for 24 hour parking will be allotted for 72 hour parking by permitted vehicles.

Tracking of permits will be the responsibility of the Police Department and a database of issued permits with permit numbers, permit holders address and contact information, and permitted vehicle information will be contained. Changes in information, such as a new vehicle, license plate or applicant phone number, must be reported to the Police Department to maintain accurate information.
